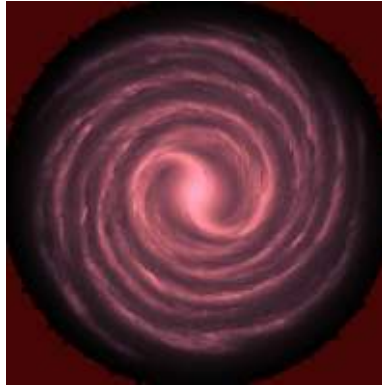

Basic Astro Components

The basic components of Esoteric Existential Astrology include (traditional terms and correspondences are noted, for interest, where relevant throughout the material):

Elements	The elements symbolize the energy substance of experience.
Planets	The planets symbolize psychological functions and life principles. They describe the regulation of energy flow, and they represent the dimensions of experience.
Signs	The signs symbolize psychological types, basic attitudes, and ways of expression. The signs are the primary energy patterns and indicate specific qualities of experience.
Houses	The houses symbolize everyday experiential life-on-earth activities. The houses represent the fields of experience wherein specific energies will be most easily expressed and most directly encountered.
Aspects	The aspects symbolize the dynamism and intensity of experience, as well as how the symbolized energies within the individual interact.
Charts	The individual is graphically represented by various charts:
Natal Chart	- The individual's character and personality profile linked to birth energy
DNA (flat) Chart	- The individual's character and personality profile linked to universal energy
Solar Return Chart	- The yearly update
Progressed Chart	- The individual's unfolding life path
Transit Chart	- The individual's current universal energy influences
Decumbiture Chart	- The individual's health analysis
Synastry Chart	- The comparing of two individuals for compatibility
Horary Chart	- Using the universal energy of "now" to answer specific questions

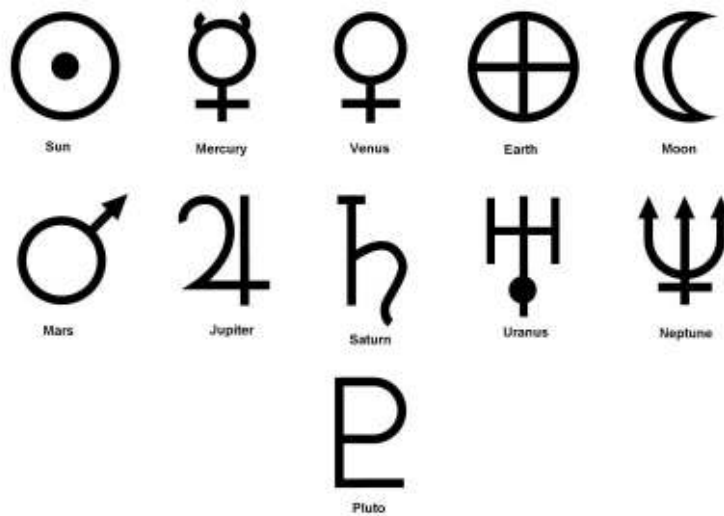
Retrograde planets in the natal chart can indicate a tension connection to a past life experience that the individual may have elected to review and re-synchronise or to resolve

Assertive, enterprising, bold, singleness of purpose; or combative, brusque, forceful, selfish

Strong Sense Of: Individuality (egotism); independence (rebelliousness)

Ability To: Crusade, grasp essentials

Nature: Inspirational, impulsive (reckless); assertive (aggressive); straightforward (naive); sporting

Requires To Cultivate: Moderation, tolerance, patience, forethought, humility

These people are assertive and self-interested. They are leaders, initiating new ventures, but may rely on others to follow things through. They can make enemies by ignoring other people's welfare.

Aries is known as the pioneer of the Zodiac, and Arians like to be 1st. Those who have this as their Sun-sign are generally uncomplicated in their attitude to life. They plan straightforwardly, and

convince the rest of us that there are no complications in what they suggest. They come straight to the point, and do not allow themselves to be held up by details or by boring or niggling problems. In this way they can achieve a great deal, provided they get plenty of back-up from others, assisting them to fill in the detail of their plans, while they themselves move on to achieve further objectives and become more involved with new and yet more fascinating plans. The basic motivation of an Arien is to push ahead, and while it is not vital to them to be "top dog" they do hate to lag behind their opponents. The out- in-front position is the truly rewarding one for them, and theirs is a very individual type of expression of ambition. They have plenty of determination which immediately comes to their aid once they have decided just what they want to do. An Arien who drifts mindlessly from one subject, job or relationship to the next (perhaps attempting to satisfy a need for a lively and varied sex-life) will be unfulfilled, and will feel restless and bored. Ariens have to make a tremendous effort to learn to be patient, and some may have to accept the fact that they will never succeed, and will have to call on other levels of their personality to help counter this failing. (Having Mer or Ven in Taurus will help, if Aries is the Sun-sign.)

The dominant Arien fault, selfishness, must be recognized as early in life as possible, and it is essential to govern it. Guilt, often coupled with some kind gesture such as a small but attractive present, will be the result when an Arien has behaved selfishly to friend or lover. Ariens are passionate by nature, and their enthusiasm for sex and the sheer enjoyment of it is communicated to their partners, who, if sympathetic to Arien needs, will get a great deal of pleasure from the relationship. Ariens have a considerable reserve of emotion which surfaces readily, and in a very positive way. They make really lively parents, and as their children get older do not generally have too much difficulty in coping with the generation gap. Physical exercise is extremely important to them, and sport, or any activity which makes demands on their physical energy, is excellent for them. Like their emotional level, their physical energy level is high, and needs plenty of positive expression.

Ariens will spare nothing in expressing their natural enthusiasm, and at least once in their lives will take some action which would prove extremely daunting to other less assertive people, hence their reputation for bravery. They are motivated to achieve a great deal. Because Aries is a Fire sign, they have enormous warmth, which is endearing to those who like lively, positive, extravert types.

Ariens cope extremely well with working in a busy and even noisy environment. The solitude and quiet of an office away from easy contact with colleagues is not very satisfactory for them, so even those in superior positions will compromise in order not to become remote or out of touch with what is going on in their business or at work.

Arien children will often feign laziness at school, because they are bored, and simply will not get involved in any subject that really does not interest them. They will cut out, drift off and think about their real interests, while the teacher fights a losing battle. It is therefore important for the parents of Sun, or Rising-sign Ariens to nurture any interest that the young Arien expresses, and to make a special effort to keep his or her initial enthusiasm stirring, perhaps by gradually encouraging the child to take up ever more daunting challenges. The competitive spirit is powerful in them, even from an early age, and you can appeal to this. If young Aries does not "win" or come out top, he or she will not have an easy time; but any setback will definitely encourage greater concentration next time round. Provided Ariens have plenty of opportunity to burn up energy and keep to a busy, lively schedule, they usually remain healthy. They have good physical resources.

The Arien body area is the head. Ariens either get an above average number of headaches, or none at all; and the cause of such headaches is usually either eye-strain or a minor kidney disorder. Their tendency to cut and burn themselves is considerable, because they are often unduly hasty and rather careless when handling sharp tools or hot dishes. Knocks and cuts to the head are often common. The influence of Mar, the ruling planet of Aries in that sign is of well above average importance when Aries is the Sun, or Rising-sign, and will colour the basic motivation and have a psychological and personal influence on the individual concerned.

Taurus

Practical, resourceful, conservative, productive; or possessive, stubborn, self-Indulgent

Conscious Aim: Security

Strong Sense of: Values (Possessiveness)

Ability To: Build, establish, stabilize, sustain, endure

Nature: Conservative (reactionary); determined (obstinate); patient (stolid); placid (lethargic); deliberate (unimaginative)

Requires to Cultivate: Enterprise, adaptability, vision

Sun-Taurus types are essentially conservative, requiring stability. They hang on to the past, preserving what is best and refusing to let go what is worst. They are sensual and creative but unambitious and slow to recognize an opportunity. Their natural fidelity is matched by their stubborn failure to change.

Taureans, to function properly, need to live their lives in the knowledge that they have the security of a regular income and a stable emotional relationship. When this is achieved they are in the right position to achieve a great deal. Their most outstanding virtue is patience, and they will plod very steadily onwards, and soon learn that short cuts are usually disastrous for them. Taureans need a steady, predictable routine, but the sort of rut in which they may get themselves will increase their sense of much needed security and within its confines they will achieve much. But Taureans must also make something of an effort to break new ground, do new and different things and be open to the opinions of others in order to move with the times and to make sure that they are not missing out on life as it is actually being lived by other people.

Visit a Taurean's home and you will relax on comfortable cushions, find the colours used in decoration pleasing and the place not lacking in beautiful things which will have cost the Taurean rather more than he or she can actually afford. This might seem superficial, but these outward expressions form an important part of the whole Taurean motivation. Possessions to the Taurean are very important. In fact, possessiveness is the major Taurean fault. The two go together. Taureans love to own beautiful things, and they really do need to be aware that their partner is not an extension of this basic urge. The realization that no one can actually be possessed by another can be a cause of real heartache to Taureans. The sooner they learn to adopt a self-analytical and critical attitude in their expression of love the better, as this can help them to express themselves in a less claustrophobic way towards their partners.

Most Taureans have a happy knack either of making money or doing a great deal with what they have. They combine this with the ability to build up their own businesses and, often with the aid of a more adventurous partner, will achieve much. They also do extremely well in banking or working for large multinational companies, as their need for financial security is then taken care of, and they can express themselves in the knowledge that the regular pay cheque will arrive when expected.

The Taurean body area is the throat; colds often begin here, with a sore throat or loss of voice. Taureans have the reputation of being the best looking people in the Zodiac, due partly to their ruling planet which is Ven. But because most Taureans love rich food, with heavy sweet things being particular favourites; consequently, they have a tendency to put on weight. Also, they are often slow movers and so do not burn up their additional calories very quickly, so a conscious and continual check on the amount of food and wine they consume is essential if they are going to keep the good looks they so often have when they are young.

Taureans make kind and loving parents, but tend to spoil their children with too many expensive presents. They can be on the strict side when disciplining their children, which may or may not be a good thing, according to the individual child. Taurean children are delightful, but it is important for their parents not to rush them. Slow, steady progress is their way, and no sudden bursts should be expected. But once a Taurean has learned something, excellent powers of retention come into play.

Many Taureans are extremely musical and it can become an important form of self-expression for them if they study singing or a musical instrument. To others the appreciation of music is important. Some will get great satisfaction from embroidery, sewing, pottery and sculpture. Basically artistic and appreciative of the arts they sometimes need encouragement to get round to spending time and energy in this direction. It is good when involvement along these lines occurs since it is one way of preventing any tendency towards being marginally sybaritic at times.

Gemini

Adaptable, communicative, versatile, inquisitive; or diffuse [not concentrated], restlessly excitable, inconstant, superficial

Conscious Aim: Establishment of relationships

Strong Sense of: Awareness

Ability To: Communicate, imitate, improvise, invent, reason, learn

Nature: Adaptable (unstable); alert (impatient); experimental (restless); inquisitive (suggestible); gay [carefree] (superficial); inconsistent, diffuse [long-winded]

Requires to Cultivate: Concentration, power to Listen, relax, and organize, sympathy

Geminians are essentially intellectuals and require constant mental stimulation. Thinkers, talkers, readers and writers, these people need to be involved in acquiring and communicating knowledge. They can also be involved in travel and it is as natural for them to be cab drivers or postmen as teachers or journalists.

Perhaps the most dominant Geminian characteristic is versatility; typically a Gemini will never only be involved in one specialist area of one subject and will never get stuck in a rut. If of necessity he or she is forced into that position, they will suffer considerably not only from boredom, something which they come near to fearing, but more deeply psychologically, too. The ruling planet of Gemini, Mer, gives them a powerful need to communicate at all levels and more often than not it will be Gemini who will speak up when something is wrong, will write to the newspapers or contribute to a "phone-in" on radio or television.

At a more personal level the need to communicate works well for Geminians because they have the ability to build up an excellent rapport with their partners, so that brooding and discontent are kept at a minimum. An air of activity surrounds most Geminians, and they tend always to be in a hurry. This is illustrated by their very distinctive, springy, fast walk. It is absolutely vital that from an early age Geminians should be helped to develop consistency of effort, because there is a strong tendency to be always moving on to some new interest or project, leaving a trail of unfinished tasks. While in many cases a little knowledge of a great many subjects can be of advantage to Geminians, it is good for them to have some kind of structured framework in their interests, in order that superficiality does not mar real progress. Basically, Gemini is rational and logical, and when their emotions surface they sometimes mistrust them. However, the position of Mer should be considered here. Its influence on Gemini is not entirely intellectual, for this sign it has a personal and psychological significance. If the planet is in Taurus or Cancer a greater balance is achieved, while if in Gemini with the Sun the tendency will be to suppress or at least question the emotions and intuitions, which will be thought of as irrational and illogical.

The worst Geminian fault is superficiality, and if this can be mitigated by the development of deeper understanding and experience the individual will have much to offer.

Many Geminians carve successful careers in all branches of the media: they make excellent interviewers, and the breadth of their interests allows them plenty of scope for expression and satisfaction. Careers in telecommunications and the travel industry are rewarding and suitable, and Geminians also make superb salesmen and women. Advertising is another field in which this lively

Zodiac type will find fulfilment and success. They are also excellent in argument and debate, and very often, for sheer pleasure, provoke what they call "discussion" which usually turns into quite a verbal battle, with Gemini swearing that he never ever changes his mind.

Gemini has very special needs in emotional relationships. Intellectual rapport and a high level of lively friendship is vital, and a partner who enjoys a varied sex-life which has scope for experiment. This Zodiac sign is flirtatious by nature, which makes Geminians great fun. They are usually fortunate enough to keep a youthful appearance, and on the whole tend to be slim, which puts them at a considerable advantage in many respects.

They have an ability to keep up-to-date with new developments and the younger generation makes Geminians splendid parents, no generation gap problems here, indeed often the reverse is true and some children seem older than their Geminian parents. The Gemini child should be encouraged to develop consistency of effort but never told to do "one thing at a time", they simply cannot function that way.

The Geminian body area covers the shoulders, arms and hands, which are accident prone. The lungs too are Gemini ruled, so coughs should not be ignored. There is also an accent on the nervous system, and it is up to Gemini to find a satisfactory outlet to counter tension and restlessness.

Cancer

Shrewd, resourceful, sensitive, protective; or touchy, self-pitying, retiring, over-motional

Conscious Aim: Emotional unfoldment

Strong Sense of: Attachment (clannish, romanticize past)

Ability To: Nurture, protect, receive impressions, economize, Publicize

Nature: Cautious (timid); emotional (moody, self-pitying); gregarious, parental (exacting); shrewd (niggling); tenacious, sensitive (touchy)

Requires to Cultivate: Logic, emotional stability, healthy imagination

Sensitive Cancerians are marked by their powerful emotions, but they usually try to conceal these behind a public mask. A valuable clue to interpretation is that the sign containing the Moon (the planet ruling Cancer) gives the nature of the public face adopted by this sign. For example, people with Sun in Cancer but Moon in Aries give an appearance of great self-confidence, while with Moon in Gemini they may give the appearance of cool intellectual observers. Cancerians place great importance on security and do not like taking risks. Domestic and family security is the key to their happiness and, when they feel safe, they are free to express their caring and compassionate maternal qualities to the full. When deprived of security they can become sharp tongued, cynical and bitter.

Challenge a Cancerian and at once you will see his or her natural self-defensive system come into play. The need to protect themselves and their loved ones is an extremely basic one with people of this Sun-sign. Used positively it is marvellously helpful, but sometimes it can result in their becoming too easily annoyed, so that a slight "huffiness" is displayed at the mildest opposition. The need to protect and look after others is 2nd nature, and indeed usually emerges at an early age; children of this sign are good at looking after wild birds or any creature that has been injured, and it is an excellent thing for them to do. Cancerians are extremely tenacious and hardworking once they have decided on a course of action, whether it relates to a life-long career or interest or to some minor domestic task or project. The tendency to hoard is very strong, so much so that it is very easy for Cancerians to fill their homes with clutter - of which it is almost impossible to get rid of.

The instinct and intuition of the Cancerian is 2nd to none, and is something that should be developed and used to the full. When a Cancerian "feels" that something is going to happen, or instinctively "knows" what decision to make, the chances of their being right are very high indeed. Cancerians are

unfortunately terribly prone to worry, and it is no good whatsoever to tell them to stop it. To counter this they should follow their instinct and learn to put no psychological barriers between whatever is bothering them and this marvellous source of strength.

The Cancerian emotional level is very high, and needs constructive channelling. Much emotion will be spent on lovers and children, no generalization where Cancer is concerned. They also have an extremely powerful imagination, and this too needs careful consideration and control. The Cancerian with no creative or positive outlet for these resources will find that they tend to become dominant. If any member of the family is late home, for instance, imagination will insist that disaster has struck, and there will be irrational worry, the children's train has plummeted over a cliff, or the car has crashed. Cancerians should use their imaginations, but in a creative way, perhaps by making beautiful things, telling bed time stories to the children (and maybe going on to write them down), or becoming involved in some aspect of history or collecting the past is very much alive for most Cancerians.

Career-wise, they do well in any of the caring professions. The hotel and catering trades are good areas, as is the Navy. Teaching is also a rewarding career for them, and there is many a Cancerian antique dealer or historian.

Cancerians make marvellous parents, though they can become too easily upset when the children leave home, and in general may be rather too clinging. They do, however, provide a marvellous home life and background in which children develop naturally and well, and those children will always feel that they and their own offspring will be welcome at home. Cancerians make marvellously sensuous lovers, but must try not to be oversensitive. Their natural tendency to say rather harsh things can cause friction, and they in their turn become very easily upset if criticized. But their tenderness and warmth do a lot to stimulate good rapport between themselves and their lovers.

The Cancerian body area is the chest. This can be a vulnerable area, but as most Cancerians are prone to worry this too can affect their health, mostly causing digestive problems, which may in themselves be a signal of worry before the subject consciously realizes that this is creeping up on him or her.

Leo

Powerful, impressive, dignified, loves to lead; or bombastic, boastful, snobbish

Conscious Aim: Creative self-expression

Strong Sense of: Dignity (vain, imperious [overbearing])

Ability To: Dramatize, radiate, enjoy, inspire faith, vivify [enliven], organize

Nature: Ardent [eager] (exuberant); magnanimous (demanding); pleasure-loving (indolent); hospitable, flamboyant (theatrical); (predatory)

Requires to Cultivate: Humility, thrift, altruism [unselfishness], attention to detail

Leos are creative in the broadest sense, and for them all the world is a stage. Either they are proud, regal and generous, or they are vain, egotistical and wasteful. Even if they are unreliable as far as others are concerned, they are completely consistent in their own behaviour; being unpunctual may be a regular habit. They are instinctively faithful but easily distracted by flattery. Their resistance to change can be a major failing. Sometimes they find that after holding the centre stage, the world moves on and they are left stranded.

Leo, the lion, the king of the jungle, must of necessity have his or her own individual kingdom, whether it is large or small. The ability of people with this Sun-sign to organize their own lives and the lives of others is paramount, as is their ability to lead. There is no doubt about it - a really flourishing Leo will make the most of this potential, sometimes stretching ability too far. There will be great

satisfaction in inspiring others to make more of themselves and in trying to impress upon them that the development of and concentration on talent is the best way to ensure a fulfilled and rewarding life. Leos get as much out of life as possible, and will always do things in as big a way as possible spending more money than they should, sometimes simply to show off. When the individual is truly developed and has gained more experience of life, money will be spent freely because he or she really appreciates quality. As for those Leos who are not well off, they will much prefer a coffee in a five- star hotel to a meal in a cheap bistro.

There is creative potential in all Leos, and the more it is expressed the better it is for them, psychologically. This does not necessarily mean that they will all be involved in the fine arts in some way, but that creativity, in the broadest sense of the word, must come into their personal scheme of things. They are ambitious, perhaps for a better lifestyle than one suggested by the mere accumulation of money; a good life-style, for them, need by no means cost a great deal, though Leo will probably have to achieve quite a good financial backing in order to cope with what he or she finally wants to do.

While magnanimous, Leos are often accused of bossiness, and not without reason. Inwardly they know that they are capable of organizing other people's lives far better than those others themselves, and find it quite difficult not to interfere. While there is a certain enjoyment in being "boss", it is also true to say that Leos will be willing slaves to someone whom they admire and respect. They need to be in a position of prominence themselves, however, if they are really to shine.

There is a natural sense of drama in every Sun-sign Leo, and they revel in it. They should not, however, just go in for making a fuss, creating scenes in public, but should use their dramatic sense to bring inspiration, light and colour into other people's lives. They should use this sense to set an example to those they come into contact with, and if they see that someone has improved their lifestyle, attitude, or any sphere of their life, then this will make Leo very happy, for every Leo believes that life is for the living, and to be enjoyed to the full. And they will work hard to achieve their ambitions, too, whether personal or career orientated.

Enthusiasm and a positive, fiery emotion are very much part of the Leo personality, and are expressed vividly in the attitude towards sex and emotional relationships. Leos can inspire their partners to greater achievement, and will do much to make marriage and permanent relationships work well, but must certainly be careful not to dominate their partners too determinedly. Their real strength lies in positive support and the continuing development of their own and their loved ones' individual interests.

Leos make lovely enthusiastic parents, encouraging their children to keep busy both in and out of school. They tend to expect too much from them, and must be very careful indeed to allow them to develop along their own individual lines and not to over-influence them, especially where the choice of career is concerned.

The Leo body area is the back. Many Leos have long straight backs and walk very well, but do tend to suffer from backache from time to time. Leo also rules the heart, so the circulation should be watched, especially during cold weather, which most Leos do not like at all. It is quite common for Leos to have a real lion's mane of hair, and, also rather lion-like, they usually have small waists.

Virgo

Discriminating, practical, critical, efficient; or fussy, worrisome, interfering

Conscious Aim: Perfection, self-dedication

Strong Sense of: Service, craftsmanship

Ability To: Analyse, criticize, assimilate, discriminate, sublimate passions, Adapt

Nature: Practical, modest (self-conscious, puritanical); sceptical, systematic, impartial (unenthusiastic); conscientious (finicky)

Requires to Cultivate: Breadth of vision, tolerance, imagination, optimism

Idealistic, perfectionist and practical, Virgos can be self-sacrificing, placing their own interests after those of a greater cause. They require a practical purpose in life and insist that this should show concrete results. High standards can make them excessively critical of others; self-criticism all too often lessens their self-confidence. They have organizational skills and an ability to cope with detail.

Of all 12 signs, Virgo is the busiest. Those who have it as their Sun, or Rising-sign will surround themselves with a great many tasks, so that their day is full of activity. It is very difficult indeed for them to relax totally, putting their feet up and doing nothing has no great appeal, so the best way for them to cut out is to move from work which is intellectually demanding to something that makes greater demands on their physical energy. Virgoan organizing ability is not very strong, and sometimes a fair amount of time and energy is wasted because they do not allow themselves enough time to get tasks sorted out or executed in an orderly way.

Here we have the critic of the Zodiac, and it is usual for Virgoans to work in a very analytical way on small details. They give marvellous support to "front" men and women, making excellent secretaries and personal assistants, and usually enjoying that kind of role rather than one which carries heavy responsibility. It is, alas, far too often the case that Virgoans are imposed upon. They have by nature a very strong sense of duty, and this can sometimes be carried to extremes, so that a young Virgoan woman will sacrifice her career to look after an ageing or sick mother, who will become more and more demanding of her and her time and energy.

If you want something done, ask a busy person to do it or ask a Virgoan. The chances are that you will get a quick response, and full value. And it can be very difficult to try to repay any good turn that a Virgoan does for us.

Because they have such a high level of nervous energy there is always a danger of tension getting the upper hand, and as a result many Virgoans suffer from bad headaches or migraine. While they are basically very logical and tremendously practical people, worry frequently gets the better of them. This will have a negative effect on their digestion (Virgo's body areas are the stomach and bowels), and very often this symptom emerges before the individual actually realizes that he or she is over-concerned about some tricky problem. But there are marvellous ways in which this Zodiac type can counter worry, and it is by using their practical and analytical approach to life that they will best overcome it. When faced with problems, they should take pencil and paper and make careful notes of every aspect of the situation; this will help clarify in their minds what line of positive action will eventually be necessary.

Because Virgoans like to live active and busy lives, they enjoy filling their out-of-work hours with a great many hobbies and interests. If they are at all artistically inclined, craft-work using natural materials (wool, clay, wood, etc) is particularly rewarding. They often have green fingers, and love tending gardens and potted plants. To ward off tension, demanding physical exercise is excellent for them, with walking, cycling and jogging being especially beneficial.

Many Virgoans are attracted to vegetarianism, and even more enjoy wholefood; they make good practitioners of fringe medicine, and are often enthusiastic about it. Just as Virgoans are discriminating and critical in other areas of life, so are they in personal relationships. They choose partners very carefully. There is a natural modesty about any Virgo in love: "He/she will never take any notice of me" tends to be the cry when Virgo is attracted to a new partner. They make good parents, and are especially keen to develop their children's intellects. Sometimes they tend to carp or nag their children (and their partners) a little too much, but usually only when they are tense or under strain caused by other problems. Virgoan children are popular at school, willing to help with small tasks which make the teacher's job easier.

Libra

Easy-going, peace-loving, friendly, artistic; or lacking confidence, indecisive, delicate, lazy

Conscious Aim: Harmony

Strong Sense of: Beauty, justice, idealism

Ability To: Negotiate, adjust, compare

Nature: Diplomatic (insincere); helpful (interfering); friendly (dependent); susceptible (wavering, easily influenced); (lazy, procrastination)

Requires to Cultivate: Firmness, decisiveness, consistency

Librans are dominated by an awareness of imbalance and motivated by the need to remedy it. They cannot tolerate a rough environment or uncouth behaviour, and often become skilled in creating beautiful and restful surroundings. Usually a sense of balance is achieved through relationships, and a need to succeed in these prompts typical pleasant manners and attractive appearance. Librans can be too dependent on other people's support and their approval.

Perhaps more than with any of the other signs of the Zodiac, the symbol for Libra, the balance, sums up very accurately the basic motivation and needs of the individual who has it emphasized in his or her birth-chart. Balance and harmony are crucial if Libra is going to function at all well, and it is the vital factor if they are going to live a fulfilled and satisfying life. Librans are not loners. They need to relate to other people in a well above average way and in all spheres of their lives, most importantly of course with a permanent partner. They have a great deal of love and affection to give to their lovers and it is only when a stable relationship is cemented that Librans become psychologically whole and function to the full. Sometimes, however, this need is so great that they will commit themselves prematurely, and as a result suffer very considerably when things go wrong.

A peaceful existence is also an important priority and the theme of "anything for a quiet life" is a recurring one. Interestingly, however, Librans need a great deal of reassurance that they are being loved, and it is not uncommon for them to go in for "rocking the boat" tactics to get that particular reassurance. They will sometimes aggravate their partners and provoke a row, because it is so nice when they make up afterwards. They may not care to admit that this happens, but it does and it is all part of Libra's interesting but not uncomplicated set-up. But it is keeping the peace that they care most about, and this leads us to consider the possibility of their inherent indecisiveness. "Wait and see" is a constant cry. They will not commit themselves, and if the possible outcome of a firm decision might be marginally unpleasant or, even more importantly, unpopular with their partners, then the chances are that they will simply wait until the situation does not exist anymore. It seems that the reason for this is that they do not want to upset their partners, and the whole thing is rooted in their inherent need for harmony. But Libra has great charm, and can achieve a great deal "all in good time". They are not to be rushed but are seldom late. Some astrologers consider Librans to be lazy.

Librans make easy-going parents, but will often pass the buck. A Libran mother will say "See what Daddy says, dear" rather than come up with a straight answer, which can be more than annoying to anxious, enthusiastic children. Libran children will break down even the toughest adult defence and will wind the strictest teachers round their little fingers.

Libra rules the kidneys, and those strongly influenced by this sign could be prone to slight kidney disorders. If they suffer from headaches this could be the cause. But their well-balanced lives, and the balance is so important to them, will usually ensure that they keep healthy.

When it comes to choosing careers, Librans do well as agents or in any role in which they have to negotiate between two people or groups of people. They should aim always to work in partnership, and could do splendidly in the diplomatic corps. Spare time interests most likely to appeal are those aligned to beauty, and which have in a sense a relaxing air to them. Music is often important; many Librans make excellent accompanists, for instance. Dress making and all kinds of sewing are rewarding, while golf and bridge also come high on the list. Social dancing and tennis are also popular.

Scorpio

Intense, passionate, secretive, endurance; or brooding, vindictive, obstinate

Conscious Aim: Power

Strong Sense of: Self-control (repression)

Ability To: Probe, eliminate, destroy, re-generate

Nature: Incisive (ruthless); intense (fanatical); strong willed, reserved (secretive, suspicious, resentful); thorough, passionate (sensual); possessive (jealous); courageous

Requires to Cultivate: Forgiveness, right direction of aspiration and energy

Emotional, intense and perceptive, Sun-Scorpio types are driven by the instincts of the unconscious. At their best they have deep compassion and a powerful healing energy, but when hurt or rejected they can all too easily retreat to a black depression. Scorpions need to learn to accept, handle and express their own deep tempestuous and sometimes obsessive feelings.

This, the 8th sign of the Zodiac, is the strongest, offering the greatest, resources of both emotional and physical energy. Those born with Scorpio prominently placed in their birth-chart must find ways of using these resources positively and in a fulfilling way. This is best achieved by expression in a career. No mere "job" is good enough for a high-powered Scorpio - they should spend their working hours doing something they consider worthwhile as well as engrossing. It does not matter whether this calls for some highly developed skill or extended study, as long as it is meaningful to the individual. When it is, then all is well, and energy will be directly channelled through this vital involvement. It is to be remembered, then, that Scorpions are capable of a great deal, and the more they have to do the better it is for them. The worst thing possible for them is when their abundant resources stagnate; then, a lot can go wrong, they will be bored, and waste their talents; worse still, Scorpio faults of jealousy and to a certain extent envy, usually of those who are making the grade, will emerge.

Scorpio emotional intensity is terrific and this, too, needs positive direction and expression through a rewarding sex- life. However, the sexy element of this sign is often somewhat over stressed. It is vitally important to most Scorpions and probably in an above-average way, but there are many other ways in which their energy can be directed, and it is very often through the achievement of daunting objectives. It is also true that this drive and determination can sometimes become obsessive, and it is important that the individual realizes that he or she may tend to become too involved. If this happens, other factors in life may be neglected, which might eventually lead to a kind of imbalance which is not healthy either physically or psychologically. However, this in itself is probably preferable to the reverse situation: inactivity caused by unemployment or some other reason not directly connected with the Scorpio himself. Restlessness, stagnation and discontent are the greater evils.

Scorpions are the natural detectives of the Zodiac. They make superb researchers, working scientifically or in libraries. Many engineers are Scorpions, as are prominent members of the armed services. The wine and oil trades are also attractive to Scorpions. From a purely physical point of view this Zodiac type needs a lot of exercise, and many will enjoy demanding sports. Boxing, the martial arts in general, diving and underwater swimming are all rewarding and popular.

The Scorpio body area is the genitals, and it may well be this connection that has given Scorpio the sexiest image of all the 12 signs. There is a vulnerability to throat infections due to the influence of the Scorpio polar sign, Taurus. Scorpions make demanding but exciting partners. They have a great love of life and never do things by half. They need partners with a similar attitude to life. Although many are of a wiry build, more tend to put on weight, usually due to good living, and this is something that needs conscious controlling. Alas, Scorpions do not find it easy to cut down in any way. Scorpions want their children to be as energetic and as fulfilled as they are themselves and will be demanding but inspiring parents. If the Scorpio child is the eldest, great care must be taken and attention paid so that

when a younger brother or sister is born there is no cause for jealousy, the worst Scorpio fault. But the children of this sign will achieve a great deal once they have become dedicated to some specific interest or subject, and such interests must be allowed to blossom.

Sagittarius

Free-ranging, optimistic, enthusiastic, idealistic; or extravagant, exaggerating, restless, inconsiderate

Conscious Aim: Wisdom, freedom

Strong Sense of: Perspective

Ability To: Explore, propagate, react quickly, prophesy, establish connections, converse

Nature: Honest (blunt, transparent); impulsive (flighty); speculative (careless); optimistic (improvident, over-confident); jovial (boisterous); versatile (dabbling); alert (superficial)

Requires to Cultivate: Restraint, sincerity, fixity of purpose, thought for others

These people are adventurers and seekers after truth. Some are intellectuals who set off on philosophical or religious quests. Others seek experience and personal growth through foreign travel. They can help themselves by establishing a sense of inner security. They can inspire others with their enthusiasm, but can be tactless. Challenge and a need to feel free to express themselves in their own individual way are the two most important requisites for those who have this sign emphasized in their birth-charts. They cannot function satisfactorily without either. Put a lively Sagittarian in a situation where he or she has work that is repetitive or makes no demands on them and they will crumble. But many, of course, have to cope with such dreary circumstances, and then it is important that they should work out ways to divert their attention from what is basically an unrewarding set up. Usually Sagittarius is resilient enough to find interesting alternatives, and it is vital that they do so, otherwise the psychological suffering they will have to endure will be nearly intolerable.

Sagittarius is a Fire sign, and this element makes its presence felt through a high level of enthusiasm for life and individual interests. To this it is possible to add that Sagittarians are keen to enjoy all aspects of life in a very positive way, and as they do so they will also inspire others to get as much out of life and their abilities as they do themselves. But challenge must be there; if it is not then Sagittarians must create it by presenting ideas to those who matter, and by showing others precisely what they are made of. It is important though that in the pursuit of many varied and diverse interests they do not lose out on the full development of what they can do best. It is also a good thing for those of this sign to express their versatility in a controlled way, by doing many different things, but making quite sure that one project is completed before another is started, so that when a year's work is assessed there will be a feeling that a great deal has been achieved in a variety of fields.

A lot is said about sport and the Sagittarian. Many astrologers tend to think this is over-stressed, having found no greater number of sports-people born under this sign than any other. They do most certainly need exercise, and often enjoy it more than many Zodiac types, and it is true that a young Sagittarian will be "coltish"; hopefully however, as time passes they will develop fine, somewhat philosophically orientated qualities which will be a source of inspiration to others. Restlessness is a major fault, but can be overcome once the individual has sorted out his or her real objectives and decided that the grass is not always greener on the other side of the hedge.

There is plenty of scope where careers are concerned. The intellectual Sagittarian will enjoy publishing or may work well in the fields of higher education, and working abroad often appeals, since many of this sign have a fine flair for languages. The veterinary profession can also be rewarding. Tradition suggests that the Law and the Church are quintessentially Sagittarian.

Claustrophobic conditions of any kind cannot be tolerated by this Zodiac group, especially when it comes to emotional relationships, chiefly because of their need for freedom of expression. Obviously if they want a meaningful relationship to last they have to compromise to a certain extent, but it is

important that they are not constrained by a partner who is jealous, or does not fully understand the way they function. Rather less importantly, Sagittarians hate a room with no view, it makes them feel closed in. Their sense of fun is infectious and their positive, extravert enthusiasm 2nd to none. This is the sign of the hunter, but that does not mean that they enjoy the pursuit of wild animals; interestingly they do enjoy hunting for bargains in junk shops.

Sagittarians make exhilarating partners in spite of their need for freedom, and will always encourage their lovers to develop their individual interests. They need an energetic, lively sex- life and will get very bored indeed with a partner who has no sense of fun or who is too pessimistic in outlook. If they keep busy and active they are usually very healthy, but the hips and thighs, the Sagittarian body-areas-are vulnerable, and it is here that most Sagittarians (Sun, and Rising-sign types) put on weight very easily. The liver is also Sagittarian ruled, hence slight "liverishness" and hangovers can be a problem.

Sagittarians also make extremely lively and somewhat demanding parents, no bad thing, as they will certainly get a great deal out of their children because of their ability to encourage them in just the right way. Children of this sign must be given a lot of positive encouragement, but may need controlling in a gentle but firm way so that their exuberance does not become too overwhelmingly boisterous.

Capricorn

Practical, calculating, reserved, responsible; or inhibited, slow, selfish, worrisome

Conscious Aim: Integrity, government

Strong Sense of: Reverence, duty

Ability To: Utilize, conserve, crystallize, persevere, concentrate, climb, organize

Nature: Fatherly (austere, severe); just (scrupulous); cautious (suspicious); economical (mean, miserly); ambitious (snobbish, time-serving); dependable, self-absorbed (morbid); practical (uninspired)

Requires to Cultivate: Sociability, buoyancy, effective self-expression

Conservative and practical, Capricorns often lead very materialistic lives, judging people and opportunities by financial considerations, chasing status, prestige and possessions. However, they have very deep emotions which often go unrecognized or unacknowledged. It is worth their while to work at expressing their feelings more directly and openly.

Capricorn is the sign of the Goat. Here we have someone who is sure-footed and negotiates every obstacle with care but with a lively step. Only getting to the top will do, and a great deal of determination will be present in the character to help Capricorns every step of the way. But people with this Sun- sign will not stride upwards without reflection; we must not forget that here is an Earth sign, and the influence of that element is ever- present. Every decision will be carefully taken, every challenge and opportunity carefully assessed, so that risks are minimal. The free-ranging mountain goat will then be able to use every bit of potential to the full, and feel that life is worth living.

But what of the other half of Capricorn? Remember that the creature of the sign is only half goat. It has a fish's tail. Is this the "wet fish" side of Capricorn? Or the poor domestic goat, forever tethered to a post in the valley, and in no position to scale the mountain top? It is both, for in essence they are similar. A negative, hopeless attitude can make its presence felt with those of this sign. Many feel that they will never "get on" in life because there is so much against them. When this is the case, their friends and lovers must do their best to reassure them. As noted, there are two distinct types of Capricorn. Our lively "giddy" mountain goat and our "wet fish"; or, if you prefer it, our "domestic animal". Basically it is not difficult to decide which category our Capricorn friends fall into, but what is interesting is the fact that they will from time to time reverse their roles, so that unexpectedly we will

find the lively, positive, aspiring mountain goat making its presence felt in someone who tends in general to be negative in outlook, and we can get more than the odd grumble and moan from our sure-footed, ambitious Capricorn friends.

One of this sign's most endearing qualities is its off-beat sense of humour. We find the most dour, serious-minded Capricorn suddenly making the most unusual and witty remark, natural to them and a delight to others. Very often at such times they themselves will smile a grimacing kind of smile, the corners of their mouths turned down rather than up, an instantly recognizable characteristic.

It is often the case that those born under this sign do not have a ready gushing flow of emotion. There is a tendency to coolness in love, for instance, and enthusiasm for new ideas may be somewhat muted by their typical matter-of-fact attitude. However, once committed in love they have tremendous loyalty, and while most young Capricorns will to a certain extent "play the field", on a more serious level they are usually discriminating. They have on the whole very good powers of concentration, and long arduous study will pay off. Short cuts do not. There is, too, a considerable sense of pride, and their inherent ambition will encourage them to aspire to move up the social scale. A desire to impress other people is also characteristic.

The Capricorn body areas are the knees and shins; these are vulnerable, as are the teeth, skin and bones. Capricorns make good athletes and long, distance running and rock-climbing are sports that could well appeal. Individual effort can be more fulfilling than participation in team games; Capricorns do well on their own and can cope with loneliness far better than many Zodiac types.

Capricorn parents are eager for their children's progress and so will make considerable demands on them. Sometimes they can become somewhat remote from their children; they are very keen to carve a better life for them than they themselves had and as a result they may become preoccupied with their own careers and have less fun with their children than they might. Parents of Capricorn children should help them to develop warmth and sensitivity.

Aquarius

Detached, independent, reformative, idealistic; or unconventional, erratic, rebellious

Conscious Aim: Truth, knowledge

Strong Sense of: 1st principles, altruism [unselfishness]

Ability To: Investigate, co-ordinate, synthesize, plan, reform

Nature: Intellectual (doctrinaire); detached (remote); scientific (agnostic); humanitarian, unconventional (perverse, incalculable); individualistic (anarchical); expectant

Requires to Cultivate: Warmth, human touch, practical ability

Aquarians aspire to be different. They have a reputation for being progressive, radical and eccentric, and this is sometimes deserved. In a liberal atmosphere they may express their differentness by being authoritarian or conservative. They hate being tied down and treasure their independence. They often seem to be supremely self-confident but can suffer from a low opinion of their own talents. They need to be more at ease with their feelings and should learn to integrate their radical ideas with practical life.

Aquarius is the individualist of the Zodiac. Show two people with this sign prominent in their birth-charts a list of characteristics of the sign, and the only thing they will agree on is the fact that they share none of them. This sign bestows a great need for independence, which very often emerges in the building of a rather special and somewhat different lifestyle. Here, too, are some of the kindest, most helpful and friendly people of the Zodiac. They have a happy knack of knowing when help is needed and will give it freely without ulterior motives. However, although we may know them extremely well, if we think seriously about it they are in many ways extremely private people. This

could well be because of their need to be independent, and while having the capacity to give much of themselves to others they do not want to get too emotionally involved or find themselves in a situation which is at all cloying or heavy.

Unfortunately it is often the case that a great many people with this sign stressed in their birth-charts have considerable psychological difficulty in relating intensely and in depth to other people. The reason for this is very complex, and does of course vary considerably from individual to individual, but basically it may well come back to the very powerful inherent need for independence. To live with someone or to marry them must of necessity mean that considerable independence is relinquished, and when it comes to a total commitment many Aquarians do not feel they can make what to them is a considerable sacrifice. But let it be stressed that there are obviously a great many who have Aquarius as Sun, Rising, or Moon-sign yet are settled and fulfilled in their permanent relationship. These must understand that other planets will have given them support where it is most needed, and the problem has been solved.

Aquarians have great originality and real flair, which can be used in a variety of fields, and should be allowed full expression. They often do well in the so-called glamour professions: theatre, television, the beauty trades, or anywhere where their originality can be expressed freely and rewardingly. Many carve successful careers in science, and interestingly it is very often the case that Aquarians are fascinated by the remote past and the equally remote and distant future archaeology and geology at one end of the scale and space fact and fiction at the other. This too can colour the choice of spare-time interests.

Aquarians make excellent forward-looking parents, and will sympathize with their children when they become involved with the concerns and crazes of their generation. But, surprisingly, Aquarians can be very stubborn and extremely unpredictable, and it is their children, as much as their friends and partners, who will become aware of these particular, and to all intents and purposes somewhat unexpected, traits. Parents of Aquarian children must respect their tremendous need for independence, and learn to accept it and the fact that while they may appear somewhat zany there is probably more common sense in their personalities than may appear on the surface. Interests that are way out or wild must not be discouraged, here is young Aquarius expressing his or her originality.

The Aquarian body area is the ankles. These are vulnerable. The circulation is also ruled by Aquarius, and it is necessary to keep it moving well. Skiing is often enjoyed, and is good exercise. Dance, aerobics and athletics are all excellent.

Pisces

Sympathetic, impressionable, artistic, emotional, or impractical, secretive, deceitful, timid

Conscious Aim: Understanding

Strong Sense of: Sympathy

Ability To: Believe, permeate, renounce, sacrifice self, and receive impressions

Nature: Easy going (lazy); plastic (unstable); imaginative, poetic (unworldly, chaotic); suggestible (hypochondriac); emotional (self-pitying)

Requires to Cultivate: Determination, concentration, avoidance of stimulants

Sensitive and emotional, Pisceans are imaginative dreamers. Often they prefer the safety of private fantasy to the fuss and bother of real life. They are impractical and avoid problems and conflicts by simply slipping away when these appear. Pisceans are impossible to pin down and hate committing themselves or taking decisions. If they discover a cause or a deep personal interest (perhaps artistic, philosophical, or charitable) they will follow it with unshakable dedication while remaining indifferent to everyday affairs. The symbol of two fishes swimming in opposite directions represents a need to reconcile contrasting possibilities.

Pisces is the poet of the Zodiac. With signs of the Water element emotion is plentifully expressed at a moment's notice: the dilating pupils of the Piscean eyes will at once tell us when the individual is moved. Pisces is, of course, the sign of the fishes. But look at the symbol: two fishes swimming in opposite directions, with a cord in their mouths connecting them. This sums up Pisces beautifully, for along with Gemini and Sagittarius this is the 3rd of the "dual" signs of the Zodiac, giving the usual versatility, but also in this case a tendency to oppose the self. Though Pisceans know what they want to do, for reasons best known or possibly unknown to themselves, they often tend to take a totally different line of action, and in doing so can cause chaos and confusion for themselves. This kind of action seems a psychological necessity for many Pisceans, and it may have its roots in their highly developed sensitivity to other people's feelings, for they put their own feelings very low on their list of priorities. This can certainly make life extremely complicated. But there are other reasons, too, for in their Piscean confusion they often deceive themselves (tending to drift up on to cloud nine) and will also tell the odd white lie to get themselves out of any mildly tricky situation. However, it does not end there for they then have to go in for ever-increasing cover-ups, and all too soon the situation has got out of hand and Pisces is in dead trouble, either at work, or with their parents or lovers. It is hard for them to learn that this is not the way to a truly rewarding and fulfilling life; but once they realize this crucial fact they develop in a very positive and rewarding way.

Here we have the kindest and most charitable of all the signs. Pisceans will make many sacrifices for other people, a trait they share with their polar or opposite sign, Virgo. Sometimes this tendency will get out of hand, and the marvellous potential present in most Pisceans is frittered away or comes to nothing because Pisces is otherwise occupied. But it might just be that Pisces will divert time and energy in some "sacrificial" way because of an inherent lack of self-confidence. If they are busy caring for others or fulfilling a supportive role, then they do not have to fight to keep up with opponents in their field or cope with the rat race. Opting out, they find that a cloistered life gives them a sense of security, and this in a subtle way is a modern expression of the religious aspects of this sign, the "monk-like" or "nun-like" aspirations of the past, in essence very Piscean. They do particularly well in the caring or medical professions.

But what of the Piscean poet? Of course not all Pisceans go dreamily around with notebook in hand composing verses, though when they do, they do it very well. There is, however, creative ability in most Pisceans. It needs tremendous support and encouragement from partners, as do all practical aspects of their lives. When this is available, their talent emerges strongly. They make excellent dancers and ice-skaters and enjoy swimming, and all these activities are physically good for them. But above all it is involvement in the fine arts that is particularly satisfying on all levels.

Pisceans make excellent, warm lovers and their abundant emotion is expressed well and positively in this sphere of their lives. They should be careful not to allow their feelings to get out of perspective or their ample imaginations to run away with them. They need a sound, sensible but sensitive partner. They tend as parents to be too kind, and may perhaps let their children get away with "murder". This is something their partners should look out for, and if necessary intervene if children seem to be getting out of hand.

The Pisces body area is the feet, Pisceans either have marvellously neat ones, and no trouble, or are in constant difficulty. Shoes will either be a perennial problem or a continual source of delight. There is a tendency to worry, which may cause stomach upsets. When troubled in this way, Pisceans should fall back on their ample intuition and natural instincts.

The Ascendant

The Ascendant relates to the individual's personality, and Sun Sign analysis may be applied to the ascendant, provided that the following distinctions are made:

- 1) The sun's characteristics apply to the individual's deep inner motives.
- 2) The ascendant's characteristics relates to the individual's outward and visible way of expressing the "qualities" of the sun's characteristics.

Putting it all together

When analysing the chart, the major factors should be taken into consideration in the following order:

1. Factors indicating major tendencies:

- a) Balance of elements - is there an emphasis of one or more of the elements (Earth, Water, Fire, and Air)?
- b) Balance of qualities (Cardinal, Fixed, and Mutable) - is there an emphasis on one or more of these?
- c) Strong aspect patterns - is there a "T" Square, Grand Cross, Grand Trine, or other significant aspect patterns?

2. The Ascendant and the Rising sign - analyse the Ascendant by sign, house, the house of the Ascendant ruler (the planet ruling the Rising Sign), and aspects made by the Ascendant and the Ascendant ruler. This is the personality of the individual.

The Ascendant ruler is also known as the "chart ruler" or "ruling planet".

3. The Sun sign, its house, and the aspects made by the Sun. This is the character of the individual.

4. The Sun ruler (the planet ruling the sign containing the Sun) its sign, its house, and its aspects.

5. The Moon sign, its house, and the aspects made by the Moon. This is the disposition of the individual.

6. The remaining planets in order from Mer to Plu, their houses, their signs, and their aspects.

7. The moon's nodes and any other factors to be considered (existential analysis does not place too much importance relative to the moon's nodes). This is the individual's associations.

Houses

When looking at each house consider the following:

- a) Planets in the house
- b) The sign on the cusp
- c) The house ruler (the planet ruling the sign on the cusp)

Consideration of the house ruler should be left to the last. Although it provides additional information it can be confusing.

Interpretation of the house ruler becomes significant when there are no planets in a house.

Subheadings

The following subheadings are useful as a guide for areas of interpretation. These may be combined or added to as desired. For example, emotions and relationships may be considered either together, or separately:

- 11. Death

1. General Character

The Ascendant; planets in the 1st house; the Sun and Moon; major patterns and outstanding features such as element emphasis; Ascendant ruler; and any other general features.

2. Family, Parents, and Children

a) Family

Planets in the 4th house; 4th house ruler (planet ruling the sign on the cusp of the 4th house); 5th house (children); 3rd house (brothers and sisters); 10th house and the 10th house ruler, if relevant; Moon (mother); and 4th house with Sun and Sat (father) if relevant.

b) Parents

The general factors of the father are the Sun and Sat, of the mother, the Moon and Ven. If these bodies are much afflicted it may denote trouble involving the parents, or they may be unsympathetic towards the individual. Favourable aspects between the Sun and Moon usually show a harmonious relationship between the parents.

The parents are also ruled by the 4th and 10th houses. The sign on the cusp of either house, planets therein and the condition of the house ruler indicate the individual's attitude towards his parents. An attitude usually conditioned by their own circumstances and character, so that it is possible, to a degree, to suggest their natures and activities from the natal chart of their offspring.

There fixed rule as to whether the 4th or the 10th house rules the father. Sometimes the sign on the cusp appears to represent one parent, the planet occupying the house the other parent. The parent most responsible for establishing the domestic atmosphere is probably shown by the 4th house, and the parent who does most to foster the individual's ambitions by the 10th house.

c) Children

It is not advisable to consider whether the individual will become a parent solely on the analysis of their own natal chart. As relationships evolve, one chart may blend with another to increase the probability of fruitfulness.

The condition of the Moon is very important. The 5th house, as the creative index of the horoscope, must also be considered. See whether the Moon, planets in the 5th, and the planet ruling the 5th are in fruitful signs. Water signs are the most fruitful (Can, Sco, and Pis); Conversely, Ari, Leo, and Cap are the least fruitful. Gem and Sag may produce twins, but they are otherwise not particularly fruitful. The other signs are moderately fruitful.

Fruitfulness and fertility is increased by aspects from Ven and Jup; and is diminished by the Sun, Mar, and Sat. Malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) in the 5th house may not deny children, but they can cause children to be troublesome or difficult to rear. In a female horoscope the applications of the Moon before leaving the sign it is in will show possible offspring. If it makes no application, the possibility of offspring is lessened. The Sun in a barren sign and afflicted by Sat is an indication of childlessness in a female horoscope. In a male horoscope, a prominent Sat afflicting the Moon and Ven may denote sterility.

Judgement of the sex of children may be a somewhat tricky matter. In general, a majority of indications in masculine signs (Ari, Gem, Leo, Lib, Sag, and Aqu) shows male offspring; and in feminine signs, (Tau, Can, Vir, Sco, Cap, and Pis) it denotes female offspring. However, complications arise when feminine planets are in masculine signs. Consequently, an analysis of the individual's hands will assist in the confirmation of possible offspring.

3. Emotions

The Moon, Ven, and any planets in water signs (Can, Sco, and Pis).

4. Relationships, Love and Marriage, Friends and Enemies

a) Relationships

The Descendant; planets in the 7th house and the 7th house ruler (close partnerships and marriage); planets in the 5th house and the 5th house ruler (romance); planets in the 11th house and the 11th house ruler (groups, acquaintances); planets in Lib (partner ships); Mar (social energy); Moon, Ven, and planets in water signs (Can, Sco, Pis) if relevant.

b) Love and Marriage

The condition of Ven by sign and aspect shows the extent to which the individual is able to live in harmony with a partner.

The 7th house is the house of partnership and marriage and the sign on the cusp, its ruler, or any planet therein may describe the nature of the partner.

Symbolically, a man comes to terms with the female side of life through his wife. The Moon and Ven are general factors of women, hence strong afflictions to these bodies can either deny marriage (especially if Sat is involved) delay marriage, or cause troubles in a marriage relationship.

The Sun and Mar represent the male principle and it is to the analysis of these bodies that indications of marriage in a female horoscope are confirmed. When these bodies or the 7th cusp are much afflicted, marriage may be denied, or certainly difficult to bring about.

When Sat contacts do not bring delay they are apt to show marriage to an older partner. Ura aspects are often disruptive, causing sudden attractions or repulsions to arise with disconcerting and unpredictable effects upon relationships. Ven afflicted by Ura, but well aspected by Sat, can show separation without the marriage being dissolved.

Those with Ven in aspect to Mar usually marry. An aspect between the Sun and Moon is also likely to show marriage. As the majority of such people marry, it is advisable to anticipate that the individual will do so unless there are strong indications to the contrary.

Women are likely to marry if they are born with the Sun aspecting Mar; men, with the Moon aspecting Ven. A good aspect between the rulers of the Ascendant and 7th house is a good sign for marriage. Aspects to the "Part of Marriage" show whether the partnership is likely to be a happy one.

The formula for calculating the "Part of Marriage" is:

$$\text{Longitude of Ascendant} + \text{Longitude of Descendant} - \text{Longitude of Ven}$$

Love affairs are ruled by the 5th house; and planets in the 5th house and the ruler of the 5th house show how love affairs are likely to prosper. Good aspects between planets in the 5th and 7th houses, or between the rulers of these houses, greatly assist the individual's love life - the reverse is true when there are bad aspects.

Factors of marriage in multiple signs may denote several marriages. When Mar and Sat are together noted in the indications, marriage may be to a widow or widower.

Ven retrograde in a man's horoscope may cause him to avoid women; similarly, a woman with Mar retrograde may seek to avoid men. The 1st application of the Moon in a male nativity and of the Sun in a female nativity on the days after birth to a planet within orbs of an aspect at birth show the circumstances of the marriage and sometimes indicate the type of partner. Application to a retrograde planet may denote difficulties, or may show an attachment that is broken. When the appropriate luminary (Sun or Moon) makes no application to a planet before leaving the sign it is in, marriage may be denied.

c) Friends and Enemies

Generally speaking, planets well placed by sign and favourably aspecting the Sun or Moon or the ruler of the Ascendant represent friends; those planets badly placed and afflicting the Sun or Moon or the ruler of the Ascendant may represent potential enemies. Afflictions from Nep are likely to indicate treachery and deceit, while a situation of Ura and Mar in affliction usually indicates an uncompromising opponent. An afflicted Mar (Ruler of Ari and co-ruler of Sco) may denote difficulties with individuals of Ari and Sco, and so on. Similarly well-aspected planets indicate the possibility of beneficial relationships with individuals of the sign ruled by those planets.

Those dates during the year when the Sun is in good aspect with a well-placed planet in the horoscope show the birth dates of possible friends; days when the Sun is in adverse aspect to planets badly placed in the natal chart show the birthdays of those who may be antagonistic. A satellitium (three or more planets in a sign) in a sign may bring frequent contacts with the individuals of that sign.

A well aspected 11th house shows the ability to make and keep friends. Afflictions involving the 11th house indicate either separations from friends, unfortunate friends, or an inability to choose friends wisely. Good aspects from a planet in or ruling the 11th house to a planet in or ruling the 10th house may show help from friends in the career. The same applies to contacts involving the other houses. Malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) in the 7th house may show an unfortunate approach to others that defeats the formation of settled friendships and occasionally arouses antagonism.

5. Mind, Mental, Intellect and Education

Mind

Mer; planets in the 3rd house and the 3rd house ruler (ability to communicate, school education, general interests and mental skills); Jup; planets in the 9th house and the 9th house ruler (higher education, philosophical outlook); 8th and 12th houses (indications of intuitive skills); Nep (imagination); planets in Gem and Vir, if relevant.

Mental Characteristics

It is not possible to confirm from the horoscope the amount of intelligence possessed by the individual, only the type of mentality and the general approach to intellectual activities (use hand analysis for a more in-depth analysis of the individual's intelligence potential). This is shown by Mer, according to its sign and house position and the aspects it receives. The planet throwing the closest aspect to Mer is the most important, because Mer is extensively coloured by its contacts with other planets and by the sign it is in.

The Moon rules the brain, and any aspect between the Moon and Mer is good for mental expression, especially the square or opposition, although these aspects make for difficulty in concentration. The Moon and Mer in strong, close aspect to many planets give much versatility to the individual.

Many bodies in mutable and air signs and cadent houses are likely to engender a quick, intelligent mind. The inventive Ura has a great effect on intellect and if this planet is prominent and well aspected there may be good mental capabilities - even if Mer is not prominent or well aspected. Sextile aspects seem to enhance considerably the individual's ability to express themselves. A good Sat or several planets in earth usually shows a good measure of common sense, while a prominent well-aspected Jup gives good judgement and sometimes wisdom.

Equally important is the condition of the 3rd and 9th houses, the sign on the cusp of the 3rd, planets in the 3rd and 9th houses, the aspects they receive, and the condition of the ruler of the 3rd house. Severe afflictions to planets in the 3rd or to the 3rd house cusp can denote mental instability and, in extreme cases, insanity. A much-afflicted Moon is nearly always present in such cases.

The rising sign and planets in the 1st house, governing the final expression of everything contained in the horoscope, also colour the mental outlook. Strong close aspects to the Ascendant affect the brain and severe afflictions can cause damage to this region.

6. Artistic and Creative Ability

Planets in the 5th house and the 5th house ruler; Mer, Ven, Mar, and Nep, and if relevant, consider planets in earth signs (practical skill - Tau, Vir, and Cap).

7. Career

Midheaven; planets in the 10th house and the 10th house ruler (career); planets in the 6th house and the 6th house ruler (working conditions, nature of job); Mar (practical energy); Sat (self-organization and discipline).

The nature of the individual's employment is usually shown by the sign on the cusp of the 10th house, planets in the 10th house or by the ruler of the 10th house. Planets in strong close aspect to the Midheaven degree or any planet in a dominant position may have significant effect upon the individual's career choice. The Sun, which is closely connected with what an individual does, may show the individual's occupation by its sign or house position.

The planet in closest aspect with the Sun sometimes indicates the vocation.

Here is a traditional guide to the occupations denoted by the signs (and corresponding houses) when they are connected with the 10th house:

Ari - Engineering, politics, the armed forces, work requiring enterprise and initiative

Tau - Farming, building, architecture, finance, banking, music, occupations involving set routine

Gem - Transport, communications, journalism, agencies, teaching, publishing, printing, advertising, secretarial or clerical work, occupations involving travel and familiarity with a number of different environments

Can - Commerce, catering, shop keeping, hotel business, cookery, plumbing, laundry work, nursing, market gardening, and occupations connected with the sea, liquids, with catering for public tastes or supplying domestic needs

Leo - Public entertainment, stockbroking, company promoting, jewellery or cosmetics, occupations giving scope for creative work organizing ability or self-exploitation

Vir - Clerical or secretarial work, editing, teaching, chemistry, photography, nursing, medicine, physical culture, horticulture, grocery, food supplies, public hygiene, tailoring, haberdashery, occupations demanding technical or analytical skill or affording opportunities for service or patient application to detail, often in a subordinate capacity

Lib - Art, politics, the Law, salesmanship, brokers, agents, fancy goods, occupations involving partnership and the adjusting of human relationships

Sco - The armed forces, police, surgery, banking, mining, undertaking, the meat trade, refrigeration, scientific research, brewing, work underground or connected with the sea, liquids or sanitation, work demanding determined effort and intense concentration

Sag - Publicity, communications, the Law, the Church, lecturing, philosophy, travel, exploring, importing, foreign agencies, work where foresight and willingness to take a chance are assets

Cap - Public administration, government service, politics, work calling for organising ability, integrity and perseverance

Aqu - Work in public corporations, civil service, electricity, lecturing, water distribution, occupations allowing scope for inventiveness and the detached application of special rules and formulae

Pis - Nursing, medicine, work in hospitals, prisons, asylums, or connected with large animals, films, footwear, alcohol, the sea cloth and woollen goods, oil

Regarding careers, signs and houses often act through their polar opposite, so that actors sometimes have Aquarius strongly tenanted (not Leo), and a strong 11th (not 5th) house. A double sign on the Midheaven may mean two simultaneous occupations or a number of changes of occupation. The 2nd house (income) and the 6th house (duty) also have some effect upon the choice of career.

The individual's occupation is likely to have a connection with those things denoted by planets in the 10th house or closely aspecting the Midheaven. The ruler of the Ascendant well aspected in the 10th denotes a "rise in life".

8. Money

This is represented by planets in the 2nd house and the 2nd house ruler; and planets in the 8th house and the 8th house ruler.

Money is governed primarily by the 2nd house, planets therein and the aspects to them, the sign on the cusp, aspects to the cusp and to the ruler of the 2nd house. A good aspect to a planet in the 2nd house or to the ruler of the 2nd house from a planet in the 5th house shows the possibility of gain through speculation. A bad aspect from the 9th house may show the possibility of losses abroad, and so on.

A healthy financial situation is shown by the benefics (Sun, Ven, and Jup) well placed by sign, angular and well aspected, especially if the Moon is involved; by favourable aspects to Jup from the heavier planets, and by a good aspect between the Sun and Moon. A good aspect from Sat to a prominent Jup may show permanent wealth.

A bad aspect from Sat to the Moon, especially when either body is angular (in cardinal sign/house) or Sat or another afflicting malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) is elevated above the Moon, can cause great difficulty in obtaining sufficient money. Many planets in the 2nd house show gains or losses from various sources. Mer there well aspected by the benefics (Sun, Ven, and Jup) shows the earning of money through good abilities. Cardinal signs on the 2nd house cusp suggest an ambitious attitude towards financial matters; fixed signs the opportunity of a fixed income (often through investments), and mutable signs a fluctuating income, sometimes from more than one source. Speculation is ruled by the 5th house and inheritance is ruled by the 8th house.

9. Travel

Planets in the 3rd house (short journeys); and planets in the 9th house (long journeys).

Although theoretically the 3rd house represents short and the 9th house represents long journeys, in practice it will be found that there is little difference.

Those with the Moon in aspect to Mer are most likely to travel, for their basic restlessness will keep them on the move. This tendency is much diminished when these bodies are in fixed signs.

Much travel is likely when Mer and the Moon are configured with Ura, Nep, or Plu, or when they are in a "T"-square with Jup, and many planets are in mutable or watery signs.

Ura, Nep or Plu in the 4th house sometimes denotes one who is constantly on the move. Sat in the 4th shows that the individual prefers to stay put.

Afflicted planets in the travel houses may show dangers while travelling. If there are malefic planets (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) on the angles (the cusps of the right angles created by a horizon and meridian axes are called the angles) of the horoscope, a change of residence may be desirable.

A congenial locality should be that which brings the benefics (Sun, Ven, and Jup) on to the angles (the cusps of the right angles created by a horizon and meridian axes are called the angles) of the horoscope when it is recalculated for the latitude and longitude of the new residence.

A comparison of the birth horoscope with the horoscope of a place will often indicate whether that place will benefit the individual. If the condition of the 9th house is very much better than that of the 4th, residence abroad might be advisable.

10. Health

This is represented by planets in the 6th house and the 6th house ruler; and general indications from other factors.

Should any other information be required:

- a) Turn to the relevant house in the horoscope and examine the planets it contains
- b) Examine the sign on its cusp
- c) Examine the planet ruling the cusp sign
- d) Examine the general planetary ruler. For example, for the law, turn 1st to the 9th house (which rules the law) the planets it contains and the planet which rules its cusp, and then to Jup, the general ruler of the law

For leisure activities examine Ven, the 5th house and general factors such as the Sun sign.

The 6th and 8th houses have much to do with health and the signs on these cusps usually indicate vulnerable areas of the body. Generally speaking, the parts of the body ruled by the signs are also ruled by the corresponding houses.

The greatest threat to health is from an angular malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) that afflicts both the Sun and the Moon. Afflictions tend to work out by polarity. Any cardinal afflictions may affect the head, stomach, kidneys, and bones; fixed afflictions may affect the throat, heart, trunk, genitals, and circulation; mutable afflictions may affect the nerves, lungs, limbs and, bowels.

Afflictions to the Sun show constitutional and hereditary weaknesses; to the Moon, functional disorders arising after birth. Moon afflictions are critical in childhood. Aspects from the benefics (Sun, Ven, and Jup) to the Ascendant and the Sun and Moon are a great help in overcoming afflictions from the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu), though much will depend on the relative strength of each. Rising malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) afflicting the Sun or Moon, or the ruler of the Ascendant afflicted in the 6th, eight, or 12th houses may bring prolonged ill health.

Mar by affliction brings fevers, cuts, burns, scalds, wounds, and over-activity; Sat brings falls, chills, sluggish activity, sprains, dislocations, and bruising; Ura brings excessive vitality, nervous tension, cramps, stricture, paroxysms, and paralysis; Nep brings hypersensitivity, wasting, coma, and hypochondriac tendencies; Plu, eliminative disorders, and deep-seated toxic conditions.

Good health results from a Moon that is free from affliction, well aspected by Jup and Ven, when the Ascendant is not tenanted or afflicted by the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu).

Although it may be possible to estimate the potentialities of an individual in relation to health and disease, it should be born in mind that medical astrology is a complex subject, requiring specialised medical knowledge if the best results are to be obtained.

11. Death

The cause of death is usually shown by the 8th house and the circumstances in the closing years of life by the 4th house. An afflicted 8th house is likely to indicate death through illness or accident, whereas an afflicted 4th may denote difficult domestic conditions in old age. If the individual dies young it is a moot point whether the 4th house indications apply.

The Kind of Death

Death is of two kinds:

- 1) Natural - arising from disease or old age
- 2) Accidental - arising from a variety of un-natural causes

A Natural death may be judged to ensue when there are no signs in the horoscope to the contrary.

A violent or Accidental death occurs when the Sun and Moon are afflicted by a malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) and when no assistance is given by Jup or Ven.

Again, when the Sun is afflicted by one malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) and the Moon by another (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) or when the Moon alone is afflicted by more than one malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) or the Sun alone by more than one malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) providing always that no assistance is given by Jup or Ven, then a violent death is indicated.

If the afflicting planets are in the violent signs (Aries, Scorpio, and Capricorn) then this is an additional sign of violence - also if the Sun or Moon are in violent signs (Aries, Scorpio, and Capricorn).

The following aspects occurring in a horoscope, give warning of a violent death:

- 1) Mar afflicting Sun and Moon by conjunction or angle, or afflicting one of the luminaries (Sun or Moon) only, and elevated above it.
- 2) The Sun or Moon afflicted by the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) in the 1st, 6th, 8th, 10th, or 4th house.
- 3) A malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) in the 1st or 8th, or on the cusp of the 7th, if at the same time afflicting the luminaries (Sun or Moon) or one of them.
- 4) Malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) opposing one another from angles (the cusps of the right angles created by a horizon and meridian axes are called the angles), particularly from violent signs (Ari, Sco, Cap) or cardinal signs (Ari, Cap, Lib, and Can).
- 5) Both the Sun and Moon afflicted by one or more of the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) if one of the luminaries (Sun or Moon) and one of the afflicting planets are in a violent sign (Ari, Gem, Sco, and Cap).
- 6) Both luminaries (Sun or Moon) afflicted by a malefic (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) one of the luminaries (Sun or Moon) being oriental.
- 7) Two malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) attacking the same luminary (Sun or Moon).
- 8) Plu and Nep must both be considered as malefic planets if they are afflicted by adverse aspects, especially of the Sun, Moon, Mar, or Sat.

If Plu is in the 8th house this will give an indication of death occurring through involvement in some public catastrophe connected with the work that is being carried out - such as an explosion, building collapse, or if in one of the Military Services, through such objects as mines, torpedoes, submarine, or aircraft crash, and other violent ends.

If in private life, through such catastrophes as mine disasters, underground railway, railway, or car crashes. Nep in the 8th brings a danger of drowning, or poisoning, or of death through wrong drugs being taken or administered, or of overdoses of an anaesthetic.

If, with these indications, you find Jup or Ven in trine or Sextile to the afflicted luminary (Sun or Moon) then danger is averted by strange interventions, or hair-breadth escapes will be made.

When the afflicting planets are in human signs (Gem, Vir, Sag, and Aqu) then the death will be by human means.

The 8th and 4th houses have chief signification in this matter, and the planets in them, together with their aspects, will indicate the nature of the death. Violent planets, such as Ura and Mar, or Sat and Nep, when in violent signs (Ari, Gem, Sco, and Cap) are testimonies of an untimely end.

When Nep is the afflicting planet, he causes deaths by ambush and treachery. And also death by drowning, and by strange spiritual causes. There is danger of trance or simulated death, which must be carefully watched.

With Ura as the cause of evil, death results in some extraordinary and remarkable manner. It can incline to suicide, especially if Mer is found to be weak and badly afflicted, or Ven afflicted by Sat or Ura, and the luminaries (Sun or Moon) also afflicted.

Sat causes deaths by crushes, fractures, falls, and drowning etc., according to its sign and house.

Mar causes death by burns, cuts, loss of blood, scalds, ruptures, frenzy, and in violent and military conflict circumstances. The exact nature is usually judged by the sign occupied by Mar, but the houses occupied by Sat and Ura must also be considered, in addition to the signs that they are in.

Mar has special indication of the cause of death according to the sign it occupies, whether human, animal, airy, fiery, earthy, etc. Observe always whether the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) afflicting the Sun or Moon are elevated above the luminary (Sun or Moon) or the reverse; for when you find the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) so afflicting, and in elevation above the luminary (Sun or Moon) it is a sure sign of a violent end.

The lord of the 8th house being afflicted by malefic planets (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) is an additional sign of a violent death.

Do conclude a violent death will happen, unless the positions are very striking and unmistakable.

When death is judged to ensue from natural causes, the 6th and 8th houses are taken into consideration, together with the signs in which the malefics (Mar, Sat, and to a lesser degree Ura and Plu) are placed.

Fixed signs show death by blood (Aquarius), disorders of the throat (Taurus), heart affections (Leo), and generative system (Sco).

Common signs show colds and affections of the lungs (Gemini), bowels (Virgo), and nervous system (Sagittarius and Pisces).

Cardinal signs denote death by affections of the head, brain fever, etc. (Ari), stomach (Can), the kidneys and liver (Lib), also erysipelas and disorders of the skin (Cap).

If Sat is in the 8th house, the death will be slow and tedious. If Mar is in the 8th house, death will be quick and painful. If Ura is in the 8th house, death will be sudden and unexpected.

If Jup is in the 8th house, death will be in comfort and order.

If Ven is in the 8th house, death will be peaceful and without pang or throe (violent pangs) of pain.

The Moon and Mer are passive, and act according to the nature of the planet in nearest aspect, but the Moon has a signification of death in the public streets, or in the presence of strangers, in public hospitals, and other places of a public nature, when other testimonies point that way.

Nep in the 8th house operates to produce trance, coma, and simulated death, ending in syncope (loss of blood-pressure).

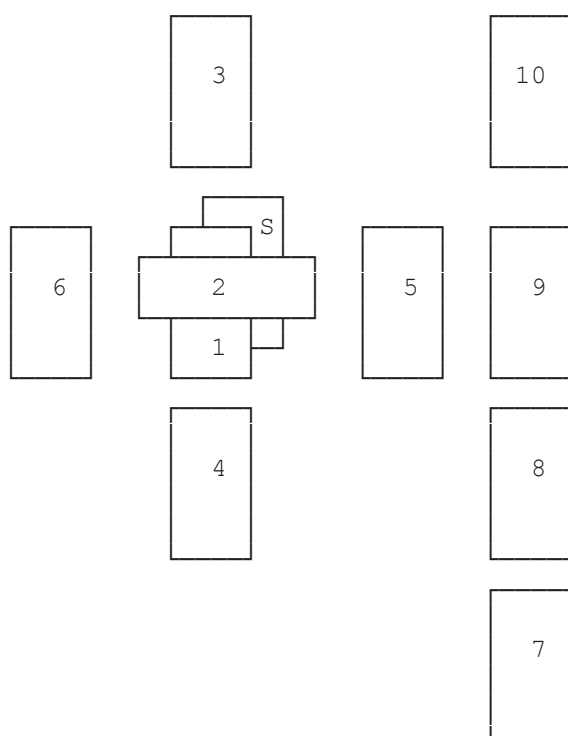

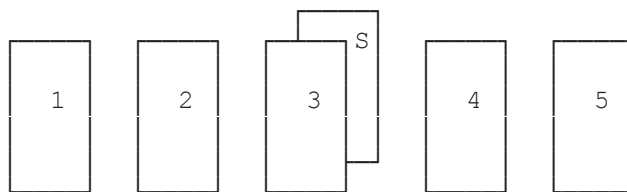

Biochemic Remedy Dosage

Biochemic remedies and dosages can be noted and used for intentions and broadcasts.

Biochemic Remedy Dosage <i>(After Schuessler)</i>	
<p>Unlike "true" homeopathic remedies, tissues salts are taken with frequency over a period of time with no worry of an aggravation.</p> <p>How often a dose is taken during the day depends on the condition and whether it is "acute" or "chronic" - your practitioner will advise you regarding specific dosages.</p>	
Administration	
<p>Tablets should be placed on or under the tongue for optimal effect, since they are best absorbed through the mucous membranes.</p> <p>For children less than three months, and pets, crush the tabs and place under the tongue. Alternatively crush the tabs and add to a little warm water.</p> <p>Do not handle the remedies - tip the tabs into the lid or onto a plastic spoon. Some authorities recommend that the remedies do not come into contact with metal implements (metal spoons, etc).</p> <p>When storing the remedy containers, they should be kept dry, tightly closed, and away from heat and strong aromas.</p>

<p>For acute conditions, a dose of 4 tabs every 30 minutes if the condition merits it. Then take hourly and two hourly as the condition improves. <p>For children under three the tablet can be crushed and the powder given or dissolved in a little warm water.</p> <p>Practitioners will often just prescribe one or two of the tissue salts on their own in order to deal with the problem. Each tissue salt has what is described as a large "picture" associated with it and could cover a very wide range of symptoms in a case.</p> <p>The Remedies are perfectly wholesome and may be taken freely at any time. Nothing is to be gained by increasing the size of the dose but frequency of dose may be varied as occasion requires.
