What is the origin of the "Days of the Week"?

**Days of the Week** - It is curious that while we owe the names of the months to Rome, those of the days are Old English:

Sunday	- (O.E. <i>Sunnandæg</i> ), day of the sun.
Monday	- (O.E. <i>Monandæg</i> ), day of the moon.
Tuesday	- (O.E. <i>Tiwesdæg</i> ), from Tiw, the god of war.
Wednesday	- (O.E. <i>Wodnesdæg</i> ), from Odin, the god of storms.
Thursday	- (O.E. <i>Thuresdæg</i> ), day of Thor, the god of thunder.
Friday	- (O.E. Frigadæg), day of Freya, goddess of marriage.
Saturday	- (O.E. Saterdæg: Lat. Dies Saturnus), day of Saturn, the god of time.
